School Context

Calvin Christian School is a growing coeducational school providing the highest quality Christ-centred education for students from Kindergarten through to Year 12. Our School is committed to working in partnership with parents in the education of their children. In providing an education presented from a Christian worldview, Calvin Christian School recognises the importance of educating children holistically, in the social, emotional, physical and spiritual aspects of their lives.

At Calvin we partner with parents to engage and equip students for a life beyond school. From Kindergarten to Year 12, we offer young people the opportunity to belong to a transformational Christian learning community that celebrates and cares for them as unique individuals, enabling them to be their best.

2022 School enrolments were 588 students from Kindergarten to Year 12 across the Primary and Senior Campuses.

Student Attendance

The average rate of attendance for students in Kindergarten to Year 12 was 87% of the total number enrolled.

Student Achievement

Students achieved across a range of criteria and measures. While standardised testing does not measure the full extent of a child's educational achievement, they do indicate progress in core areas of learning.

TASC Results

Calvin Christian School students continue to maintain exceptionally high TASC results. In 2022, 92% of our students achieved their Tasmanian Certificate of Education.

Of those students who achieved their TCE in 2022, 70.6% also attained an ATAR score whilst the majority of the remaining students opted to take courses that did not lead to an ATAR. The median ATAR attained by Calvin Christian School graduates was 85.55 with a Calvin student placing within the top 101 students in the state.

A number of our students successfully completed UTAS courses as part of their studies, including Object Design and the High Achiever Program (Indonesian). Two of our graduate students completed VET studies as part of their Calvin studies.

Teaching Staff

Calvin Christian School's teachers are four or five-year tertiary trained professionals who hold current registration with the Teachers Registration Board of Tasmania. In 2022 we had 48 teachers working across the School with 27 holding full registration. Provisionally registered teachers are part of our professional development programme and are given the opportunity and support to progress to full registration.

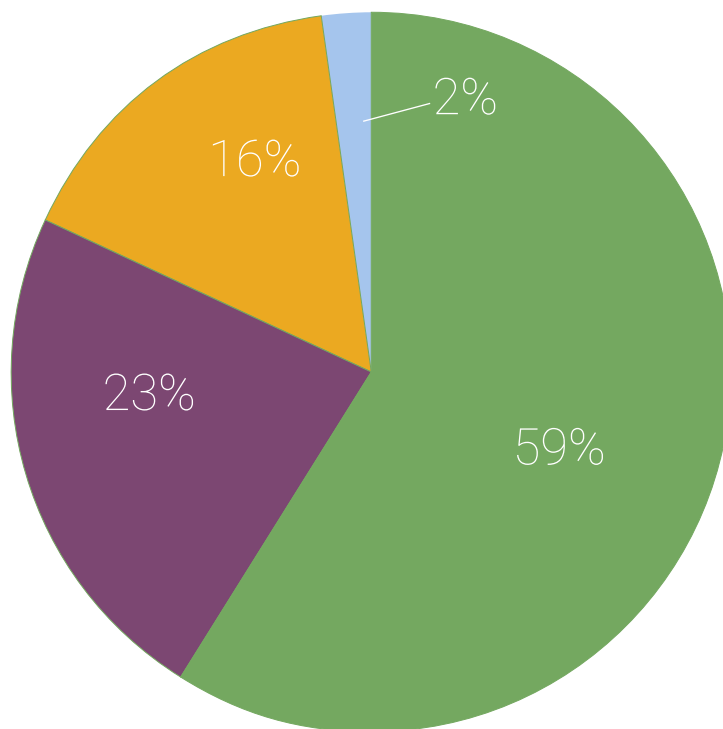
