## *From the Principal*

I wish to publically thank the work of the School Council and Mrs Denice Walter in conceiving and planning for the visit of Melinda Tankard-Reist to our school, and Hobart.

This initiative by our School Council wonderfully demonstrates their commitment to positively impacting both our school and the Hobart community.

As parents, they enjoy the benefits that the current social culture provides to their children. They also have to combat the assaults against their children that this same culture makes.

The expression of my concerns simply adds to their existing concerns. They have listened to my reports regarding the challenges to our youth in these changing times. I have lamented about the interpersonal atrocities that have been enacted through photos, texts, websites and Facebook accounts. These atrocities have shattered parental perceptions of innocence, scared reputations, and strained parent-child relationships.

Council's response was to organise Melinda Tankard-Reist to speak at our school. It has been a powerful, practical and transforming action.

The members of School Council and I think that parents have a role in prompting the conversation about the issues that affect our young people.

These conversations need to be:

- More concerted;
- More informed;
- More regular; and,
- More evident.

People need to have the proper revelation about what is happening. People also need to have an accurate vision of a wellness alternative.

Within our curriculum planning we are currently discussing the establishment of an outstanding Health curriculum. Our orientation is to present a wellness model. It is worthy to remember that

when the FBI teach its operatives how to detect counterfeit currency they only ever show the trainees the perfect note. They study the ideal so thoroughly that it is easy to identify the forgery.

Melinda Tankard-Reist provided the revelation about the rampant sexualisation of girls and the objectification of women, as well as a strong message about the nature of positive relationships. Melinda spoke to the K-12 staff on Monday afternoon for over an hour. She made presentations to all girls in Year 9 to 12, and then also to all boys from Year 10 to 12. I delivered an age appropriate message to the Year 9 boys on attitudes to women. Following these presentations a number of students encouraged their parents to attend Melinda's evening talk at UTAS.

These presentations have had a very significant impact on the conversations and attitudes in our community. They have prompted a number of personal changes and called some student groups to action.

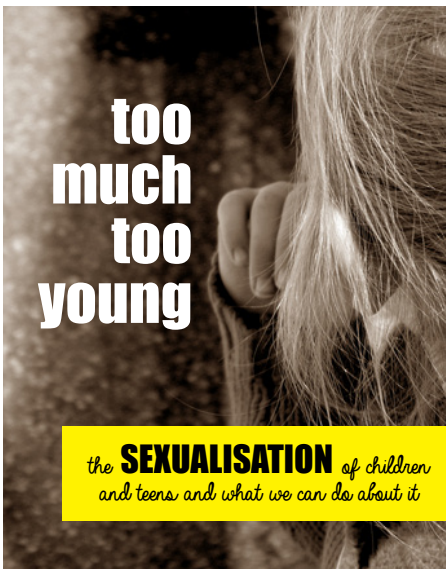
## TOO MUCH TOO YOUNG FORUM

People flocked to The Stanley Burbury Theatre at UTAS on Wednesday night to listen to the presentation “Too Much Too Young” by Melinda Tankard-Reist on the sexualisation of our children and teens, and what we can do about it. Calvin Christian School Council sponsored the community event, and with over 300 people attending, it is clearly an area of concern for many.

Many of the people who attended stated afterwards that they felt “informed”, “amazed”, “shocked”, “angry” and “enlightened” regarding the level of sexualisation our children and teens are experiencing in today’s culture. Melinda clearly and undeniably demonstrated that this attack is not hidden in dark alley ways, nor is it buried in the back of some shady store. Rather it is very mainstream in our society and is there for all to see and access. She also challenged us to not accept this, but to use our voices, both individually and collectively, to affect positive change.

Calvin Christian School Council plans to continue holding events such as these, as it is one of our responsibilities that we take very seriously. We would like to acknowledge that this event was initiated by Denice Walters, and thank her for this. We are very grateful to all people who assisted in making this event as successful as it was.

We trust and pray that this will be the beginning of many more conversations we have as a community on how we can best support and care for our children.

On 27th April, the Housing & Design 3 senior class visited the Sustainability Centre at Mt Nelson, as part of their study into passive solar design.

Students enjoyed a tour of the Government funded architecturally designed centre, to see first hand, how this building promotes environmental sustainability using renewable and natural resources like sunlight, rainwater and cooking oil to make it an energy efficient building, designed specifically to have minimal impact on the environment.

The students were inspired by the use of recycled materials and the architectural smart design that makes use of natural day light and ventilation to reduce energy consumption.
